## **GDPR Privacy Notice**

	• <b>in all other cases:</b> that it is necessary for our legitimate interests which are to build a programme to encourage participation in bowling and does not prejudice or harm rights and freedoms of parents / guardians or the children that join the programme.
Your right to withdraw consent	Where you have given your consent to any processing of personal data, you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time. If you do, it will not affect the lawfulness of any processing for which we had consent prior to your withdrawing it.
Location of your personal data	The Club will keep your personal data within the United Kingdom
How long we will keep your personal data for	<ul> <li>We will not retain your child's personal data for longer than is reasonable and necessary for the purposes for which it was collected.</li> <li>We shall retain your personal data for such time as you are registered with NWKBC as a member.</li> <li>1 year after you cease to be a member of NWKBC or play an active part in NWKBC, we shall delete your data.</li> </ul>
Your rights in respect of your personal data	You have the right of access to your child's personal data and, in some cases, to require us to restrict, erase or rectify it or to object to our processing it, and the right of data portability.
